
## **Timelines of Christian History**



Christian History can be marked in four segments of roughly five-hundred years.

1<sup>st</sup>: The Patristic period (early fathers) through the fall of Rome in 451.

2<sup>nd</sup>: Early Medieval to the schism of East and West in 1054.

3<sup>rd</sup>: Late Medieval, scholastics, and corruption, to the reformation in 1517.

4<sup>th</sup>: Reformation splinters, modernism and secularism in the present day.

Throughout this time, we see waves of complexity and reform; corruption and reform. The reforms were often led by:

- Monks: dessert fathers, Benedictines, Franciscans, Luther
- Theologians: Athanasius, Cappadocians, Augustine, Luther, Calvin, Hooker, Barth
- Bishops: Leo, Athanasius, Gregory, Augustine, Leo IX, John XXIII, John Paul II
- Missionaries & Evangelists: Paul, Augustine of Canterbury, Cyril, Patrick, Jesuits, Livingstone
- **People**: communities (Amish, Moravians), preachers (Whitfield, Wesley)
